(March 7, 2018)- For the 25th consecutive year, the Orange County Sanitation District (OCSD) earned the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting (CGFO). Lina Hsiao, OCSD's Accounting Supervisor, as the individual primarily responsible for OCSD earning the CGFO award, received the Award of Financial Reporting Achievement by the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) of the United States and Canada.

These awards are a representation of the dedication of the Department of Finance and Administrative Services to preparing comprehensive annual financial reports. According to the Government Finance Officers Association, "In governmental accounting and financial reporting, the comprehensive annual financial report (CAFR) is the highest form of recognition, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management."

About the Award

The Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) established the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting (CAFR) Program in 1945 to encourage and assist state and local governments to go beyond the minimum requirements of generally accepted accounting principles to prepare comprehensive annual financial reports that evidence the spirit of transparency and full disclosure and then to recognize individual governments that succeed in achieving that goal. The goal of the program is not to assess the financial health of participating governments, but rather to ensure that users of their financial statements have the information they need to do so themselves.

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Reports submitted to the CAFR program are reviewed by selected members of the GFOA professional staff and the GFOA Special Review Committee (SRC), which comprises individuals with expertise in public sector financial reporting and includes financial statement preparers, independent auditors, academics, and other finance professionals. OCSD is a public agency that provides wastewater collection, treatment, and recycling for approximately 2.6 million people in central and northwest Orange County. OCSD has two operating facilities that treat wastewater from residential, commercial and industrial sources.

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
