



As part of the Orange County Sanitation District's (OC San) Capital Improvement Program, the Seal Beach Pump Station is being replaced. The 1970's station is located at the corner of Seal Beach Blvd. and Westminster Ave. in the City of Seal Beach. The project will start this spring and last approximately four years.

The pump station is nearing the end of its useful life and needs to be replaced with a new facility that will include a more efficient pumping system, odor treatment systems, and a standby emergency generator. The new station will be constructed on the same site, once fully operational, the old pump station will be demolished.

- Bus stop closure. Please visit www.octa.net for alternative routes
- Seal Beach Boulevard Lane closure. Northbound lane closure nearest the pump station for the duration of construction. The number of driving lanes will be reduced from three to two.
- Westminster Avenue Lane
 closure. Westbound lane nearest
 the pump station will have
 temporary closures between the
 hours of 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and 7
 p.m. to 6 a.m. while work is being
 done in the adjacent area.
