

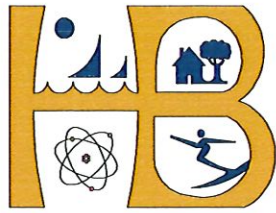



As the General Manager of the Midway City Sanitary District this request will directly support our shared effort to improve the reliability of our regional wastewater treatment system and deliver high quality water for the Groundwater Replenishment System to drought proof our region. The requested assistance will support the construction of this vital conveyance system that brings in approximately 120 million gallons of wastewater through six major truck sewers that combines, measures and removes debris and grit that otherwise could end up in the ocean.

The Headworks Rehabilitation Project is ideally suited to receive federal assistance. It is my understanding that the Senate recognized the significant importance of water recycling and improved water quality most recently when it passed the Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Assistance Act. This project directly supports the goals of this bill.
